








WHAT TO SEE AND DO

With miles of glistening beachfront, you could easily spend your trip to the coast camped out on the shore beneath an umbrella. But if you're looking for adventure, the Crystal Coast has you covered. Take an excursion to the Best National Park Beach (by USA Today 2016) with Island Express Ferry Services. WHERE TO WINE AND DINE

The Crystal Coast is packed with charming eateries sure to delight every taste. Pescara Wood Oven Kitchen is a cottage lover's dream. Seated in a magnificently restored cedar plank home, you'll find the interior design to be just as delicious as the menu. The rustic, coastal Italian fare adds a unique flair to the "beach food" scene, and the Yellowfin Tuna Puttanesca is a must-try. Front Street Grill at Stillwater is another excellent choice, located right on the Beaufort waterfront. The ahi tuna tacos and Painkiller cocktail are the best in the area. While in Beaufort, pop into Beaufort Grocery Co. for a lunch sampling of local flavor featuring deli sandwiches, creative homemade soups, and incredible fresh-baked breads. For a "Gourmet Hole in the Wall" in Atlantic Beach, check out The Island Grille. Finally, enjoy a family-friendly hot spot at Amos Mosquito's for a fresh-from-the-dock seafood menu and festive swamp theme décor-and embrace the local scene as Thursday night sushi and karaoke is not to be missed.
